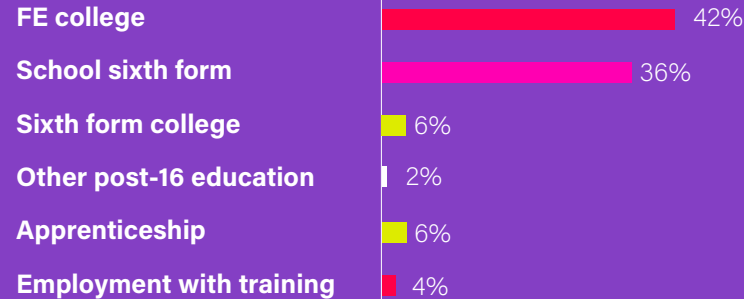

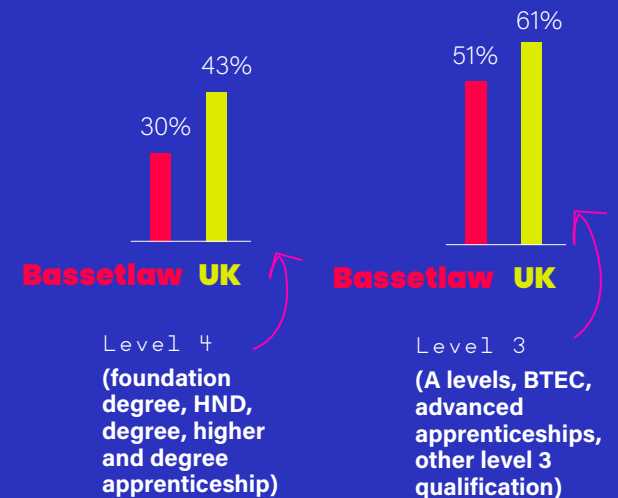

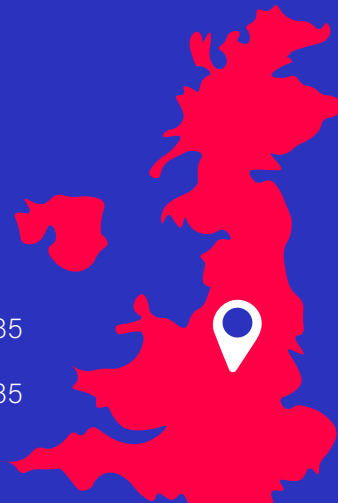
The higher the qualifications you have, the more jobs you'll be able to apply for. Here's how the qualifications levels in Bassetlaw compare with the UK average:
